Just a Reminder— What You Can Currently Recycle With Us

#1 & #2 Plastic bottles - empty & rinsed* Aluminum cans - empty & rinsed*

Tin cans - empty & rinsed*

Shredded paper - in clear plastic bags

Newspaper

Used printer/ink cartridges (no toner)

Used candles

Corrugated Cardboard - flattened

Plastic bags and film - #2 & #4

Car batteries

*If it is not rinsed, it is considered <u>contaminated</u> and goes <u>straight to</u> <u>the landfill</u>—the exact opposite of what we are all trying to do!
